Vijayawada: Chief minister N Chandrababu Naidu has said that world-class universities and health institutes are coming up in Amaravati which will turn the region into a medical and healthcare hub. He laid the foundation stone for Amaravati America Institute of Medical Sciences (AAIMS) that will come up near Ibrahimpatnam on Thursday.

"It's a proud moment that around 21 top educational institutes will come up in Amaravati. SRM, VIT, Indo-UK, BR Shetty Medi City and now AAIMS are coming up in the new capital region. This government is giving thrust on creating medical and health facilities so that the public will be healthy and happy. I am glad that those belonging to this region are coming back to invest here after pursuing their dreams outside," said Naidu.



CM lays foundation for the hospital

The CM said that AAIMS with 1,200 beds will come up in three phases at a cost of Rs 600 crore. The first phase with 300 beds hospital is expected to be ready by 2019. About 500 beds will be added in the second phase and 400 in the third, he said and lauded the promoters of AAIMS who had returned from the US to start the institute here and hoped that soon patients from the US would come to Amaravati for medical treatment.
